What information do we collect about you?

- Name, Address and contact details
- Vehicle ownership details
- Parking space ownership

How will we use the information about you?

The Council's purpose in collecting the information on the online survey form is to enable it to assess the viability of and demand for the introduction in the borough of an EV charging point service. We may only process the information for the purpose of this survey with your consent under the terms of GDPR Article 6(1) (a). Your personal data may be shared with the Council's Street Scene Department, Hertfordshire County Council, Highways England, private and central/ local government grant funding bodies.

Withdrawal of consent for us to process your personal data

How long will we keep this information?

The servers on which we store personally identifiable information are kept in a secure environment which is continually monitored and tested.
